

Black History Highlight – Robert Smalls



Robert Smalls, a historic figure, Civil War hero, and ultimately United States congressman, was a cousin of Benjamin Smalls, deceased husband of Mary B. Smalls, an Oakwood University Church member now living in the Atlanta area and lifetime member of the J. L. Moran Alumni Chapter of Oakwood University.


Robert Smalls, in one of the most daring feats of the Civil War, seized the 147-foot Confederate sidewheel steamer, the *Planter*, in 1862, commandeered the vessel from the headquarters of a Confederate general and ran the gaunt-

let of fortifications to deliver the valuable ship and its massive guns to Union forces. In so doing, Smalls won freedom from slavery for himself, his crew, and his wife and two young children who were hidden on board.

Although the South hoped to punish Smalls, he became one of the most famous African Americans in the country. He met with President Abraham Lincoln and members of his cabinet. He delivered orders from the secretary of war that authorized the first regiment of Black soldiers to serve in the U. S. Ar-

my. He served as a civilian pilot of Union ships and served in combat in a number of campaigns around Charleston, SC. He became the first Black captain of an Army vessel. In 1864, Smalls bought the home in which he and his mother had once served as house slaves.

Between 1875 and 1887, he was elected and served as a five-term member of the U. S. House of Representatives from South Carolina. Smalls was also a major advocate for free compulsory education in South Carolina and started several schools for African Americans in the state.



Smalls deserves to be remembered and celebrated for his contributions throughout his life. He is a true American hero.

It's no secret that Oakwood Adventist Academy (OAA) has a mother and daughter working side by side.

Tyler Lee, who is a 2018 graduate from OAA has decided to give back, why, because OAA is in her DNA. She is the 4th grade teacher. Her love for teaching was being developed in high school. She spent her summers working at the Oakwood University (OU) pool where she was a lifeguard and swimming instructor. Tyler has spent every summer at the OU pool from being a student (1 year old) to an employee (16 years old). Why is this so important--because this is not her first time teaching some of her current students. She was their swimming instructor long before she decided to become a teacher. In addition to spending her summers at the pool, she spent time at her mother's school helping out. Again, she was introduced to the classroom long before she decided to become an educator.

As a first year teacher, she is following the legacy of her mother Julie Lee who graduated from Lynwood Academy (1985), then attended Oakwood College, and returned back home to California to finish and graduate from La Sierra University (1990).

Julie started her teaching career in Orlando, FL where she taught 2nd and 3rd grade for 8 years in the Orange County Public Schools. After getting married and moving to Little Rock, Arkansas, she taught 1st grade for 1 year before moving to Huntsville, AL where she taught Kindergarten, first, and third grades for 22 years in Huntsville City Schools (HCS).

She has dedicated 31 years of service in the public school system. After leaving HCS, she became a traveling reading consultant while assisting at OAA. Julie says "It has been a blessing to be able to see the fruits of one's labor. To watch your child do what you did for 31 years, lets me know that the Lord has truly blessed my child, Tyler Lee, with the gift of teaching. To be a part of her first year teaching journey is the best gift a mother could receive.

OAA is blessed to have one of their own come back home." OAA is also blessed to have Julie Tyler's extensive experience as a classroom assistant in the kindergarten and first grade classrooms.

God's Grace Preserved My Life

Life is not guaranteed here on earth, but praise the Lord, it is guaranteed for the place Jesus is gone to prepare for us (John 14: 1-3). I am a living testimony of what God can do and does for anyone who trusts in Him. This is why we are admonished to live for God each moment of our lives because none of us know when our creator will call our names.

In January 2021, I awoke from sleep; we had our morning devotion, drank thirty-two ounces of water, and went for a three-mile walk. On our return, we ate breakfast, and then I made a pan of baked spaghetti for our God-son who lives in Nashville, Tennessee. He had an

extraordinary story at birth, and we were drawn to him because of his birth situation. The trip was 90 minutes away, but I was fulfilling my promise to him in 2020. We drove the baked spaghetti to Nashville and spent some time visiting with this wonderful youth and his mother.

On our trip back to Huntsville, my husband indicated he was tired and asked me if I would drive from Ardmore home. I gladly obliged the request that he made. Praise the Lord, we made it home safely. About an hour after we arrived home, I told him that I was tired and we needed to worship our Heavenly Father so that I could go to bed. Well, do you ever wonder why certain things happen in life? Do you ever feel like God may be working behind the scenes to make something special out of your life? If so, "God works in mysterious ways" is a phrase that you may have heard before or thought about. The following bible passages give the assurance that God is in control.

Isaiah 55:8-9 states:

"For my thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are your ways my ways," declares the Lord.

9 "As the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways and my thoughts than your thoughts."

Psalm 115:3

"Our God is in heaven; he does whatever pleases him."

Deuteronomy 29:29

"The secret things belong to the LORD our God, but those things which are revealed belong to us and to our children forever, that we may do all the words of this law."

As Christians, we believe that the plan and purpose of God are ultimately unknowable and mysterious; however, it can be trusted faith.

After I went to bed, my husband decided to sit in the bed and read for a while. Well, I drifted off to sleep, and sometime after, I started making noises, and he thought I was having a bad dream. He tried to wake me but soon discovered I was not responding to his request, so he called 911 for help. The Holy Spirit must have encouraged him to stay in bed and read, which allowed him to observe what was happening to me.

The ambulance came and took me to the hospital, and after testing, it was discovered that a meningioma was present, which was large enough to press against the skull and the membrane of my brain. The need for immediate surgery was essential. Within a few days, a neurosurgeon was located. Pastor Carlton Byrd conducted the anointing, and the surgery occurred. The eight-hour surgery was successful, but within a few hours after waking, I became unconscious for two weeks.

Prayer is the breath of the soul, and without me knowing, the brethren prayed, and prayed, and prayed. God heard those prayers, and He did answer. The Bible in Psalm 46:1 clearly says, "That God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble." The word "strength" means a "might" that is so great that it upholds fellow believers, even in our most difficult times. God enables His people to stand strong through the many trials that come against them through His supernatural strength. All I can exclaim is that I am a miracle! It is truly God's grace that preserved my life.



The Huntsville Area Retired Adventist Workers (HARAW) Association grew into existence from a discussion between Mrs. Alice Brantley and Elder Harvey Kibble, Sr. **HARAW** was organized in May of 1983 as a subsidiary of the Retirees' Association of the North American Division (NAD) of the Seventh-day Adventist denomination. Since then, HARAW members have enjoyed the fellowship and camaraderie of NAD retirees by attending the annual NAD Retirees conferences held in rotation between SDA colleges and universities in the USA.

Mr. Rueben Wilson suggested the name of HARAW. The first President was Elder Harvey Kibble, Sr. He was succeeded by Mr. Adell Warren, Mr. Jonathan Roache, Mrs. Edna Roache, Dr. Frances Mouzon, Mrs. Alice Brantley, Elder Frank Jones, Dr. Alfonzo Greene, Mrs. Lovey Verdun, Mrs. Estella Greene, Mrs. Dorothy Jones, Mrs. Ruth Moore, Mr. William Parks, Mr. Robert D. Wright, Mr. Michael Tucker, and the current president is Dr. Horace Taffe.

HARAW's first secretary was Mrs. Alice Brantley. She was succeeded by Mrs. Hilda Cox, Mrs. Edna Roache, (Frances Blake, Ruth Warren, interim), Mrs. Laura Thomas, Mrs. Veda Rodriguez, Mrs. Muriel Hutchins, Mrs. Minneola Dixon, Mrs. Lovey Verdun, Mrs. Ethel Myles, Mrs. Christina Wright, and currently, Mrs. Beverly Hines.

HARAW's first "Everybody's Birthday Celebration Fundraiser Banquet" was held October, 1987. Mrs. Nora Saunders, the first financial scholarship recipient, received \$145. In 2018, **HARAW** awarded \$5,000 in scholarships to Oakwood University graduating seniors.

HARAW is an open association. Meetings are held the second Sunday of the month from 1:30 p.m. to 3:30 p.m. in the Family Life Center, Room 107 at OUC. May God **richly bless each of** you and grant us the privilege of seeing you at our next meeting.

I say my prayers and wait on You.


While waiting, I stand up, speak up, and be what You empowered me to be – that aggressive, liberated woman You helped me become




