## What It Means To Love One Another Katherine Davis, Chaplain

"A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another.... by this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another." (John 13: 34-35)

Do you know what it means to love one another as Jesus loves you? It's not an option you know. It was part of Jesus' farewell speech to his disciples which took place on the night before his crucifixion, He said, "it's a new commandment I give to you." It's really quite a tall order. Let me share with you what I think it means:

- 1. I believe the opposite of love isn't necessarily hate. It's selfishness. Do yourself the favor of asking the Holy Spirit to free your life from selfishness and fill you instead with His love.
- 2. Learn the value of compassionately sharing others' sorrow, distress, and misfortune. Rejoice with them in their successes.
- 3. Discipline your time, your eyes, your mind, all for the sake of others.
- 4. Utilize the incredible privilege of prayer. You and I have been commissioned by God and empowered by the Holy Spirit to do battle for others. Pray for them and see God's glory in your prayers. Jesus said, "Whatever you ask in my name, that I will do, that the Father may be glorified." Ask God to help you step out of your comfort zone. Make the connection, offer encouragement, and start diligently praying as an act of love. Ask God for discernment.
- 5. Patiently spend time with others, do as Jesus did, He loved them enough to warn them, challenge them, teach them, and forgive them all the way to the cross.
- **6.** Be willing to part with <u>money</u>, <u>time</u>, and <u>possessions</u> in order to serve other people. Give them **what they need**, not what **you** want to give.

**In closing,** Jesus said "People will know that you are my disciples by your love for each other." Dear ones, <u>please Hear Me Now!</u> Tackle The Challenge To:

#### Live To Make A Life

Do not live just to make a living, Rather live to make a life; For the measure of succeeding Is your service in the strife.



After graduating from Shiloh in 1981, he enrolled at Oakwood College (now Oakwood University), graduating with a bachelor's degree in Communication and a Theology minor in four years.

David began his career as a media professional in 1986 as a producer at WLRH-FM, then the only National Public Radio affiliate in Huntsville. For the next 23 years, David became known as a radio and TV personality in north Alabama. During that period, he also became a columnist and editorial board member at The Huntsville Times. At the same time, David's work also was featured nationally on NPR and in USA TODAY, BlackAmericaWeb.com, Message Magazine, and various other media outlets.

In 2009, due to the beginning of the decline of print journalism locally and nationwide, David took a buyout from The Times. He began working as a media consultant, creating audio and video content for clients as well as serving their media relations, public relations, and marketing needs.

As the owner of DavidPersonMedia, LLC, David's list of clients and partners includes former U.S. Senate candidate Will Boyd, environmental justice activist Catherine Flowers, Estella's Brilliant Bus (a CNN Hero company), and Breath of Life Television. He also is a monthly guest on Kenny Anderson's popular radio show Second Chance, broadcast Sundays on 90.1 FM, WJOU, and a political analyst at WHNT News 19 in Huntsville.

David co-hosts two weekly podcasts: Breathe, featuring Pastor Debleaire Snell and Alabama Politics This Week, with Josh Moon. He also co-created and co-produced Finding Tamika, an Audible Original hosted by actress/director/producer Erika Alexander. Comedian Kevin Hart and syndicated radio/TV host Charlamagne are executive producers. Finding Tamika, won the 2023 Alfred I. DuPont-Columbia Award, one of the most prestigious awards in the news business.

David's community commitments include being a founding member of three organizations: the Community Faith Partners, the Madison County Remembrance Project and Huntsville's Rosa Parks Day Committee. 
Shalunda Allen-Sherrod, DSW, LICSW-S,

His early years of education began in the small town of Alloway New Jersey. He spent his senior year at Oakwood Academy and continued his education at Oakwood College, now Oakwood University. He graduated with a degree in Theology in 1947.

Horace was hired by the South Central Conference of SDA and pastored in the Yazoo City and Greenville Mississippi District. From there, he was sent to Chattanooga, Tennessee. During his pastorate in Chattanooga, he married Chlora McClure on March

4, 1951. Horace also pastored in Knoxville, Tennessee before being moved to the Gulf States. While serving in the Gulf States, he pastored in three states at one time, Alabama, Mississippi and Florida.

While working in the Tennessee area, he held a tent meeting in Cleveland Tennessee and baptized 24 individuals. From that meeting, a church was established. While ministering in the Gulf States, Horace held a meeting in Atmore, Alabama and 32 people were baptized. A church was established from that effort.

Horace was called to the Lake Region Conference in 1963. While in Lake Region, he pastored in Illinois, Michigan and Indiana. He also worked in the Lake Region Conference Office in the Community Service and Sabbath School departments.

Horace continued his ministry at the Lake Union Conference as the Personal Ministries Director before moving on to South Atlantic Conference. While in South Atlantic, he pastored in Savannah, Griffin, and Lawrenceville Georgia.

Pastor Jones always believed in Christian education and aggressively supported it. While he pastored in Savannah, Georgia, Ramah Jr. Academy became the largest Adventist school in the North American Division with an enrollment of 495 students.

After 69 years of service, he retired and relocated to Huntsville Alabama. Elder Horace Jones has three daughters, Phyllis L. McCree, Alva L. Arrington and Lorna F. Knight. He has 6 grandchildren, 12 great grandchildren and one great grandchild.





#### A Parent's Heart Cry


